Focus is on East Asia related to the following:

Research Award(2001): At Ewha Women's University, Korea. Study of status of North Korean Refugees living in South Korea; study of Korean Police interaction with schools regarding youth Violence.

Fulbright Award (1984):Yonsei University, Korea: Research on status of Korean Adolescents and their families. Lecturing at the University

Described below are two research directions which exemplify the focus of my interests.

My area of expertise is with adolescents and this from a developmental psychological perspective. Studies of children and working with them and their families as lead me to the belief that the person develops along a measurable, predictable, track. The behavior of the developing youth is oriented to appropriateness. The person has developmental needs which are especially contingent on significant others, and which needs fulfillment affect the motivation for the youth's behavior, appropriate or non-appropriate.

A second strong interest is in comparative studies of persons, how other cultures promote development in their children, and what is the environmental basis for this development. The comparative focus has been on peoples of East Asia, especially Korea. This has led to research in Asia and among the so-called `new immigrants'(Asians) adjustment to and utilizing of, various components of our CJ system.

American CJ System & the 'new Immigrants'.in the U.S.

"Interaction of Police and Asian Immigrant Youth Gangs" . Being conducted with James Sutton at the University of Illinois at Chicago, International Criminal Justice Department, in collaboration with the Asian Crime Task Force, Chicago Police. Focus on Asian gang criminal activities, especially "home invasion" crime networks.
1990-present.

Violence among youth research being done in collaboration with faculty at the Institute for Children Youth and Family, MSU. Beginning 1992 and preparing a monograph on the subject.
Children Ethical Values. Their presence, their use, their source, in affecting the youths' behavior.

 - 1997-98, Humanitarian operation with Korean American physicians who are members of an American Korean Medical group. I am working with a chapter of this group in Detroit. The object is to develop sources of medical supplies and food to be sent through Japan to North Korea. We have a liaison with North Korean physicians and some individuals affiliated with the government there, and some of us will be accompanying the goods to North Korea. These physicians' are recognized by the North Korean government as an apolitical group. One outcome of this undertaking is research on North Korean children's status related to health, education, child development family relations and child labor practices.
 - 1997, Collaborating with American Korean Faculty at Michigan State University and Korean American specialists on nutrition to develop a nutrition training program for Koreans in northern China which (it is hoped) will transfer to operations in North Korea where the latter country is very interested in this area.

 - 1996, September and October: Lectured on Police Psychology at the National Police College in Shenyang City. Classroom lectures to 1,200 students; conferences with faculty on the use of psychology in combating crime and investigating criminals. Collaborated with Dr. In Gwa, psychology professor at the college ; and we are collaborating on comparative studies of deviance among Chinese and western youth.
 - 1996, Korean citizens of China. Interviewed Koreans Citizens in Shenyang and Yangbian, China. Met with Korean faculty in three Chinese Universities, including one on the northern border of China and North Korea.
