**Introduction to Cybercrime**

This course offers an introduction to cybercrime, including: computer hacking, malware, data theft, identity theft, spam, harassment, stalking, child porn/exploitation, prostitution, revenge porn, and extremism. The class will also include information on computer hardware and software used to commit cybercrime as well as techniques for identification of basic investigative information such as IP addresses, MAC addresses, and email headers.

**Introduction to GIS for Crime Analysts**

This course provides an introduction to important components of today's skill set necessary for a Crime and/or Intelligence Analyst: including Geographic Information Systems, the interpretation of aerial images (remote sensing) and a general survey of the concepts and applications of geospatial technology in the law enforcement field. By taking this course, participant will be able to approach events and crimes with a spatial perspective and learn how geographic analysis can inform and improve problem solving. Open to any law enforcement manager, officer, or analyst

**First Line Supervision**

This 80-hour course is designed for newly promoted police supervisors. Learning topics include; conflict resolution, leadership, crime analysis, monitoring and documenting employee performance, collective bargaining, situational leadership, legal issues, and ethical leadership.

**Homicide Investigation Training**

The Homicide Investigation Training is a week-long training conducted by the Michigan State Police Training Academy. It is designed for sworn Law Enforcement personnel who are assigned to detective or investigative roles. The training includes classroom training and presentations, as well as a full Mock Crime Scene Day.

**Enhancing Your Crime Prevention/Security Program**

This is a four-day interactive workshop for those responsible for public or private sector crime prevention, security and/or resource protection programs. The workshop examines Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED), security surveys, crime prevention techniques, intrusion detection systems, security lighting, crime analysis/trends and related topics.

**Corrections School of Staff and Command**

This 400-hour course is designed specifically for corrections managers and supervisors. Topics include; strategic planning, best practices for jail administrators, grant writing, recruiting and retention, jail revenue streams, staffing analysis, and inmate behavior modification.

**Police Executive Development Series**

This two-day training is designed for police executives and those identified as having high potential for reaching executive level positions. Timeless leadership issues are linked with timely current issues such as homeland security, community relations, and police ethics and integrity.
