# First Line Supervision Training

---

**The School of Criminal Justice is now accepting applications for the Spring, 2018 M.S.U. First Line Supervision Training.**

- Learning is driven by reality based work problems
  - Participants work in collaborative learning groups
  - High facilitator to student ratio 1:6
  - Blended interactive learning

This 80-hour course will begin Monday, April 23 - 25, 2018 with 3 days instruction in a retreat setting. Learners are required to stay on location. This is followed by 3 days of facilitated distance learning on May 1 - 3, 2018 and 4 days of classroom instruction on May 8 - 11, 2018 at the Eaton County Sheriff's Office in Charlotte, MI.

April 23 - 25, 2018 - Retreat  
May 1 - 3, 2018 - Distance Learning  
May 8 - 11, 2018 - Classroom Learning

Tuition cost is \$1300. Includes meals and lodging for 3 days of retreat as well as break refreshments for 4 classroom days at the Eaton County Sheriff's Office, all handouts as well as access to D2L—MSU's online learning management system.
