The School of Criminal Justice is now accepting applications for the Spring 2022 MSU First Line Supervision Training.

- Learning is driven by reality based work problems
- Participants work in collaborative learning groups
- High facilitator to student ratio 1:6
- Blended interactive learning

This 80-hour course will begin Monday, April 25, 2022 with 3 days instruction in a retreat setting. Learners are required to stay on location. This is followed by 3 days of facilitated distance learning on May 3 - 5, 2022, and 4 days of classroom instruction on May 10 - 13, 2022 at the Eaton County Sheriff's Office in Charlotte, MI.

April 25 - 27, 2022	Retreat
May 3 - 5, 2022	Distance Learning
May 10 - 13, 2022	Classroom Learning

Tuition cost is \$1350. Includes meals and lodging for 3 days of retreat as well as break refreshments for 4 classroom days at the Eaton County Sheriff's Office, all handouts and access to D2L—MSU's online learning management system.
