The School of Criminal Justice is now accepting applications for the Spring 2020 MSU First Line Supervision Training.

- Learning is driven by reality based work problems
- Participants work in collaborative learning groups
- High facilitator to student ratio 1:6
- Blended interactive learning

This 80-hour course will begin Monday, April 20, 2020 with 3 days instruction in a retreat setting. Learners are required to stay on location. This is followed by 3 days of facilitated distance learning on April 28 - 30, 2020, and 4 days of classroom instruction on May 5 - 8, 2020 at the Eaton County Sheriff's Office in Charlotte, MI.
